## UNVEILING MISCONCEPTIONS: DEBUNKING BREAST CANCER MYTHS AND FACTS- PART II

UNDERSTANDING THE TRUTH BEHIND THE BREAST CANCER MYTHS



s we embark on this Women's Day special week, we prioritize women's health and well-being. In this second article of our series, we delve deeper into the topic and provide more detailed information to help women better understand breast cancer and its impact on their lives.

### MASTECTOMY IS THE ONLY TREATMENT OPTION FOR BREAST CANCER.

MYTH: There is a common myth that Mastectomy is the only treatment option for breast cancer. However, the truth is that treating breast cancer depends on various factors such as the type of breast cancer, its stage, overall health of the patient, menopause status and patient choice. Therefore, consulting with a healthcare professional for personalised treatment recommendations is important.

### IF YOU ARE DIAGNOSED WITH BREAST CANCER IN OLD AGE, IT IS INCURABLE.

MYTH: If breast cancer is detected in old age, it does not necessarily mean that the cancer is incurable. This is a common myth. Infact, many older patients diagnosed with breast cancer can undergo successful treatment and can survive. Age alone does not determine the outcome of the disease.

AFTER LYMPH NODE SURGERY IN BREAST CANCER TREATMENT, LYMPHEDEMA IS A THUMB RULE. MYTH: Lymphedema is one of the side

> effects following lymph node surgery, particularly in the context of breast cancer treatment. However, the occurrence of lymphedema is not a universal rule, and it does not affect all individuals who undergo lymph node removal.

### EXERCISE SHOULD BE AVOIDED AFTER SURGERY TO PREVENT LYMPHEDEMA.

MYTH: Monitored exercise under the supervision of qualified professionals is advised after breast cancer surgery to prevent the risk of lymphedema in patients.

### HAIR LOST AS A RESULT OF CHEMOTHERAPY CANNOT GROW BACK AGAIN.

MYTH: Chemotherapy induces temporary hair loss. However, in most cases, hair loss during chemotherapy is reversible and hairs regrow eventually after completion of treatment.

### BREAST CANCER CAN RECUR AFTER MASTECTOMY.

FACT: Mastectomy is a surgical procedure for the removal of the breast tissue. Mastectomy doesn't guarantee non-recurrence. Regular follow-up and monitoring are essential to detect any signs of recurrence early and initiate appropriate treatment.

BREAST CANCER SURGERY ALWAYS LEAVES A BAD SCAR. MYTH: With the advancement



In breast cancer surgery and the application of oncoplastic principles, scarring can be minimized compared to earlier procedures. It is a myth that breast cancer surgery always leaves a bad scar. Oncoplastic Breast Surgery involves combining oncological and plastic surgery techniques to achieve optimal cosmetic outcomes while effectively treating breast cancer.

### IF YOU HAVE A FAMILY HISTORY OF BREAST CANCER, BREAST CONSERVATION THERAPY IS NOT A TREATMENT OPTION.

MYTH: A family history of breast cancer alone does not automatically rule out breast conservation therapy (BCT). Patients may require several tests before determining the treatment plan. Additionally, the decision of BCT is based on the stage of diagnosis, the type of breast cancer, overall health of the patient.

### HOW DOES YOGA HELP MANAGE TREATMENT SIDE EFFECTS SUCH AS PAIN AND STIFFNESS?

Practicing Yoga Asanas harmonizes the body's physiological system. The calmer effect on the body reduces muscle tension, thus helping alleviate pain. Yogic postures improve muscle flexibility and aid in muscle strengthening. Additionally, Yoga encourages lymph flow and may reduce the risk of lymphedema.

#### ARE THERE SPECIFIC YOGA POSES TO AVOID DURING BREAST CANCER TREATMENT?

Some breast cancer patients may need to avoid intense or strenuous poses, especially if they have had surgery. Poses that involve deep twists or pressure on the chest or armpits should be approached cautiously.

### HOW OFTEN SHOULD BREAST CANCER PATIENTS PRACTICE YOGA?

The frequency of yoga practice depends on Individual comfort and energy levels. It is advisable to start with a few sessions per week and gradually increase as tolerated. Even short daily sessions of gentie Yoga can be beneficial.

### HOW CAN YOGA HELP WITH EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING DURING BREAST CANCER TREATMENT?

Yoga encourages mindfulness and relaxation, reducing emotional



distress and improving mood.

### IS IT SAFE TO PRACTICE YOGA DURING CHEMOTHERAPY OR RADIATION THERAPY?

Yoga can be safe during chemotherapy or radiation therapy, but it is essential to listen to your body and modify poses as needed. Inform your yoga instructor about your treatment schedule and any side-effects you are experiencing.

### ARE THERE ANY SIDE EFFECTS OF YOGA?

Yoga is safe if performed under the guidance of qualified experts. Give your Yoga expert details about your medical condition. Report if any posture is painful.

Yoga improves the quality of life and psychological health in breast cancer patients. Hence, it is recommended for breast cancer patients as a supportive therapy.

## **PROCESSED FOODS AND CANCER RISK**

Cancer is a leading cause of death globally, according to the World Health Organization (WHO). The rise in high-fat, sugary diets, and sedentary lifestyles are significant contributors to cancer. Our eating habits have also been influenced by globalisation and the changing times, leading to changes in cooking methods, ingredients, utensils, and eating habits. Companies are providing convenient ready-to-eat options that save time and energy, but many of these foods are heavily processed and may contain common ingredients that are known to be carcinogenic.

Here are a few common carcinogens that enter our bodies through food:

### Microwave popcorns

Microwave popcorn bags are lined with Perflurooctanoic Acid (PFOA) which are carcinogenic in nature and are linked with testicular and kidney cancer.

### **Processed meats**

Nitrates and nitrites are added to processed meats like sausages, hot dogs and salamis, to keep it fresh for longer. These chemicals have cancer causing properties and thus WHO has declared processed meat as grade 1 carcinogens

### **Farm fish**

Farm fish have residual pesticides which are carcinogenic in nature.

### Instant cup noodles and canned foods

Bisphenol A (BPA) is a compound found in the linings of different canned foods and instant readyto-eat meals. It has been associated with changes in brain development, reproductive issues, and obesity, all of which can contribute to the development of cancer.





In addition to these, there are numerous artificial dyes, sugars, preservatives, and adulterants, all of which can be detrimental to health and could potentially contribute to cancer risk. To steer clear of these chemicals, it's essential to read food labels before making purchases, opt for fresh and homemade meals, and incorporate regular physical activity into our daily routine.

## **RESEARCH UPDATES: BIOBANK**

**Biobank** is a repository where biological samples that facilitate research studies are conserved and stored, we specifically have breast tissue biobank- Formalin-Fixed and Paraffin-Embedded (FFPE) and Fresh Frozen (FF).



### Formalin-Fixed Paraffin-Embedded (FFPE)

FFPE is a way of preservation of tissue samples in a paraffin block. FFPE blocks can be stored up to 12 years at ambient temperature and used for research purposes. With patient consent, we collect both biopsy and surgery blocks for the biobank. Currently the biobank houses over 1500 FFPE blocks.



### Fresh Frozen (FF)

The fresh frozen breast tissue biobank was established to facilitate genomics and proteomics studies. The 'Fresh Frozen' Biobank collects consented fresh frozen breast tissue samples from Tru cut biopsy and VAB procedures. Over 100 samples collected till date.
