## Essentials in Oncoplastic Techniques – II: A Stepwise Introduction to Level 2 & 3 Techniques & Axilla Management

The program offered a stepwise introduction to advanced oncoplastic techniques and axilla management, blending theory with practice to strengthen surgical skills and decision-making.

## **UNDERSTANDING THE ROLE OF FOLLOW-UP** CARE IN BREAST CANCER MANAGEMENT

egular Follow-up during Breast CHANGE Cancer Management is a vital part of ongoing care after the initial treatment ends. Recurrence risk can vary based on factors like patient's age, stage, type and genetic mutation. Local recurrence most likely occur within first five years, making timely and consistent follow up especially important. In this article we will explore how structured follow up contributes to improved longterm outcomes and quality of life of patient. At Orchid's Breast Health in collaboration with Jehangir Hospital and Prashanti Cancer Care milsion, follow up is a key part of ongoing support for patinets beyond active treatment.

#### WHY IS FOLLOW-UP IMPORTANT AFTER BREAST CANCER SURGERY?

Follow-up is essential to detect any signs of cancer recurrence early, detect any new breast cancer, manage long-term side effects of treatment, and support the emotional and physical recovery of the patient. It also helps in monitoring ongoing treatments like hormone therapy and maintaining overall well-

#### WHAT IS THE FOLLOW-UP CYCLE AT ORCHID'S BREAST HEALTH AFTER SURGERY?

After surgery, follow-up visits are typically scheduled on the 3rd, 6th, 9th, and 15th day, followed by every 3 months for the first two years, then every 6 months for the next two years. and annually thereafter. However, the exact follow-up schedule may vary based on individual case scenarios and treatment plans, so it's best to consult your doctor for a plan tailored to you.

DOES THE FOLLOW-UP SCHEDULE | also important.

#### BASED ON THE MOLECULAR SUBTYPE OF BREAST CANCER?

Yes, follow-up frequency and focus may differ based on the molecular subtype:

- Hormone Receptor Positive (HR+): Requires long-term monitoring due to late recurrence risk.
- HER2 Positive: Needs closer followup in the early years and periodic heart monitoring.
- Triple Negative (TNBC): Most recurrences occur within 3 years, so closer early follow-up is crucial.

#### WHAT TESTS ARE COMMONLY DONE **DURING FOLLOW-UP?**


Immediate follow-up includes clinical examination every 3 months, with additional tests as needed based on clinical findings.

Annual follow-up typically involves a mammogram, breast ultrasound, abdominal ultrasound, and blood tests such as serum calcium, vitamin B12, vitamin D3, and serum phosphorus. A PET scan may be recommended if any abnormalities are detected.

Note: Advanced imaging (CT, PET, MRI) or blood tests are not routinely done unless symptoms suggest recurrence.

#### WHAT FOLLOW-UP CARE CAN BE DONE AT HOME AFTER BREAST CANCER TREATMENT?

At home, patients can support recovery by doing regular self-breast checks, tracking symptoms, taking medications on time, eating a healthy diet, staying active with light exercise, caring for surgical site, and managing emotional well-being through relaxation or support groups. Preventing infections and watching for signs of lymphedema are



#### WHY IS GENETIC COUNSELING IMPORTANT DURING FOLLOW-UP CARE FOR BREAST CANCER PATIENTS?

Genetic counseling plays a crucial role in both the initial management and follow-up of breast cancer patients. Genetic counselling helps assess personal and familial risk, educates about genetic testing, and interprets test results. During follow-up, it guides long-term surveillance, supports early detection of recurrence or second cancers (especially in mutation carriers), and informs treatment or preventive strategies. It also plays a role in managing psychological impact and supporting family members who may be at risk.

#### WHAT LONG-TERM EFFECTS CAN BE EXPERIENCE AFTER BREAST CANCER TREATMENT?

Some effects like fatigue, mild swelling (lymphoedema), or memory changes may occur, but most can be managed well. Regular follow-ups and a healthy lifestyle help support recovery and longterm well-being.



### **RESEARCH UPDATES: BIOBANK**

**Biobank** is a repository where biological samples that facilitate research studies are conserved and stored, we specifically have breast tissue biobank- Formalin-Fixed and Paraffin-Embedded (FFPE) and Fresh Frozen (FF).



## Formalin-Fixed Paraffin-Embedded (FFPE)

FFPE is a way of preservation of tissue samples in a paraffin block. FFPE blocks can be stored up to 12 years at ambient temperature and used for research purposes. With patient consent, we collect both biopsy and surgery blocks for the biobank. Currently the biobank houses over 1500 FFPE blocks.

Total Blocks collected in this month:28

Biopsy Blocks: **18** Patients Surgery Blocks: **10** Patients



### Fresh Frozen (FF)

The fresh frozen breast tissue biobank was established to facilitate genomics and proteomics studies. The 'Fresh Frozen' Biobank collects consented fresh frozen breast tissue samples from Tru cut biopsy and VAB procedures. Over 100 patient samples collected till date.

**08** Fresh frozen Biopsy and **06** surgery samples collected this month.



## Genetic Counseling: Supporting Patients Beyond Testing



### What is Genetic Counseling?

Genetic counseling is a specialized healthcare service that helps individuals and families understand their inherited risk for conditions such as breast cancer. It provides education about testing options, result interpretation, and preventive strategies, while also offering emotional support throughout the process.

### Why Genetic Counseling is Important?

- 1. Provides clear, accurate information to patients and families.
- 2. Helps interpret complex genetic results (positive, negative, or uncertain).
- 3. Supports decision-making about risk-reducing interventions.
- 4. Reduces anxiety, improves knowledge, and enhances overall satisfaction with care.

## Ingredients (1 serving):

- 1 small ripe banana (easy to digest, soft texture)
- ½ cup cooked and cooled oats (gentle on stomach, adds soluble fiber)
- ½ cup plain Greek yogurt (or lactose-free yogurt) protein + probiotics
- ½ cup unsweetened almond milk (or low-fat milk/coconut water for hydration)
- 1 tsp almond butter or peanut butter (healthy fats & protein)
- ½ tsp turmeric powder + pinch of black pepper (antiinflammatory)
- $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp honey or stevia (optional, if sweetness is needed)

## Preparation:

- 1. Blend all ingredients until smooth and creamy.
- 2. Add more milk if thinner consistency is preferred.
- 3. Serve chilled gentle on sore throat or mouth sores.
